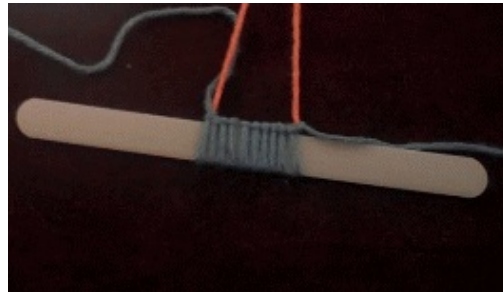


CORRECTING A MISTAKE

Removing knots tied with the lacemaker's method
from the foundation loop

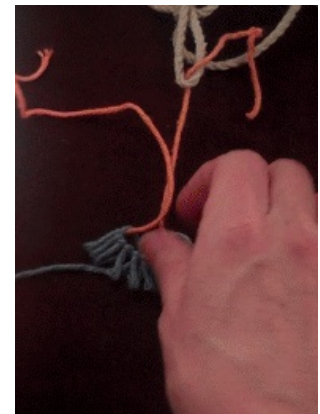
NOTE: In these instructions whenever I use the word “string” I mean whatever string, cord, twine, rope, yarn, or thread you are using to net. The word shuttle is used to represent either a netting needle or a netting shuttle.

There are times when it is necessary to remove some knots from your foundation loop. You may have put too many knots into the foundation loop, or you may have made a mistake. To remove knots from the foundation loop, you can do the following:

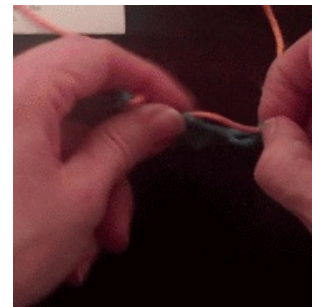
1. Remove the mesh stick.



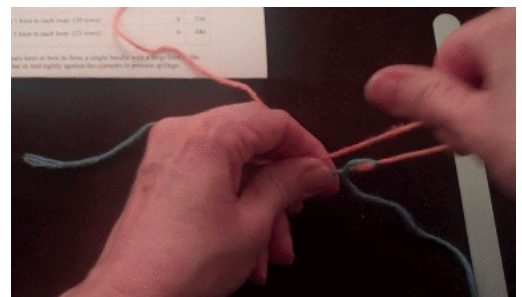
2. Untie the foundation loop and remove it from the tension device.



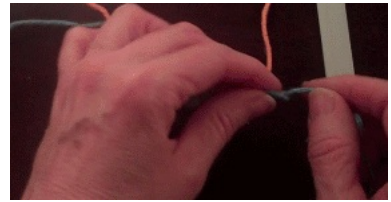
3. Slide the knots along the foundation loop.



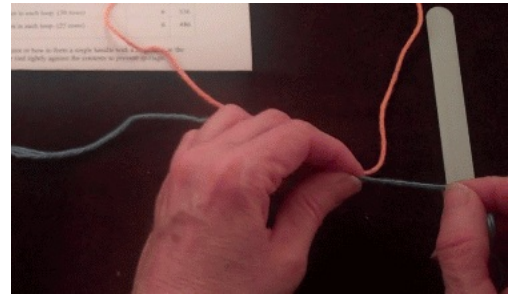
4. Slip the desired knots off one end of the foundation loop.



5. To untie the knot that was on the foundation loop, place one hand on either side of the knot.



6. Pull your hands away from each other and the knot will untie.

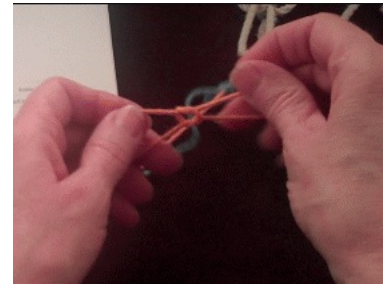


7. When all the knots that need to be removed are no longer on the foundation-loop cord, count the loops to be sure that you have the correct number.



8. Then re-tie the ends of the foundation loop together with a square knot.

9. Attach the foundation loop to the tension device.



10. Now you can either replace the mesh stick into the last four to six loops made previously and finish row 1 or begin row 2.
