Supplies needed:

tension device

cord to put through anchor

grommet anchor made of bead and crochet thread

netting needle or shuttle

scissors

mesh sticks:

2" flat mesh stick

1" flat mesh stick

1/2" flat mesh stick

Medium Circular Bag with Drawstring

24 yards of size 4 cotton yarn

44 inches of drawstring cord

Medium Circular Net Bag with Net Handle

48 yards of size 4 cotton yarn (which includes 24 yards for the handle)

Medium Circular Net Bag with Drawstring Handle

270 knots for this bag

Bag:

Round 1 (Regular Center)

mesh stick: 1"

Form grommet with 18 loops (last one tied by hand with CK). (18 loops in round)

Rounds 2-15 (Plain Stitch)

mesh stick: 1"

Net 1 knot in each loop (last one tied by hand with CK). (18 loops in round)

Drawstring Handle:

Cut 2 lengths of cord that are each 22 inches long.

Run one cord through the loops of the last row. Tie ends together with an overhand knot.

Starting half-way around the bag, run the other cord in the opposite direction through the same loops of the last row. Tie ends together with an overhand knot.

When you pull on the handles the bag will close.

Medium Circular Net Bag with Net Handles

594 knots for this bag

Bag:

Round 1 (Regular Center)

mesh stick: 1"

Form grommet with 18 loops (last one tied by hand with CK). (18 loops in round)

Rounds 2-16 (Plain Stitch)

mesh stick: 1"

Net 1 knot in each loop (last one tied by hand with CK). (18 loops in round)

Handle Part 1:

Row 1

mesh stick: 2"

Tie a triple-wrapped loop into 9 loops. Turn netting. (9 loops in row)

Row 2

mesh stick: ½"

Net 1 knot in each loop. Turn netting. (9 loops in row)

Row 3

mesh stick: ½"

Net 1 knot in each loop until 2 loops are left. Net those 2 loops together. Turn netting .
(8 loops in row)

Row 4

mesh stick: ½"

Net 1 knot in each loop until 2 loops are left. Net those 2 loops together. Turn netting .
(7 loops in row)

Row 5

mesh stick: ½"

Net 1 knot in each loop until 2 loops are left. Net those 2 loops together. Turn netting .
(6 loops in row)

Row 6-17

mesh stick: 1/2"

Net 1 knot in each loop. Turn netting. (6 loops in row)

After last row, cut yarn leaving a 4-5 inch tail and weave it into previous netting.

Handle Part 2:

Attach a full shuttle (12 yards of string) to the string on round 16 that was used to form the CK

Row 1

mesh stick: 2"

Tie a triple-wrapped loop into 9 loops. Turn netting. (9 loops in row)

Row 2

mesh stick: 1/2"

Net 1 knot in each loop. Turn netting. (9 loops in row)

Row 3

mesh stick: 1/2"

Net 1 knot in each loop until 2 loops are left. Net those 2 loops together. Turn netting .
(8 loops in row)**Row 4**

mesh stick: 1/2"

Net 1 knot in each loop until 2 loops are left. Net those 2 loops together. Turn netting .
(7 loops in row)**Row 5**

mesh stick: 1/2"

Net 1 knot in each loop until 2 loops are left. Net those 2 loops together. Turn netting .
(6 loops in row)**Row 6-17**

mesh stick: 1/2"

Net 1 knot in each loop. Turn netting. (6 loops in row)

After last row, cut yarn leaving a 4-5 inch tail and weave it into previous netting.

Finishing Handle part one and part two:

On each handle part, tie an overhand knot where the wrapped loops meet the ½" mesh netting.

Tie handle part one and part two together to form a single handle.
